

Tortoise Global Water Fund (TBLU)

2Q 2025 QUARTERLY COMMENTARY

The Tortoise Global Water Fund (TBLU) offers exposure to the otherwise fragmented water industry. We believe that water is perhaps one of the most essential assets and is an area that requires continued investment in the years to come. This fund provides access to water infrastructure, as well as equipment and service companies operating across all aspects of the water value chain, that appear poised to benefit from the expected and much needed investment in rebuilding existing infrastructure, constructing new infrastructure and better managing this vital, but finite resource.

The Tortoise Global Water Fund (TBLU) increased by 12.67% on a market price basis and 12.47% on a NAV basis during the second quarter of 2025 ended June 30th. This performance compares to the underlying index performance of 12.39%.

Tortoise Global Water Fund (TBLU) received a Four Star Overall Morningstar Rating[™] among 112 Natural Resources funds (based on a weighted average of the fund's three-, five-and ten-year risk-adjusted return measure, if applicable) as of 6/30/2025.

The Tortoise Global Water Fund uses a passive management approach and seeks to track the total return performance of the Tortoise Global Water Index®.

The S&P 500® Index is an unmanaged, market-value weighted index of stocks that is widely regarded as the standard for measuring large-cap U.S. stock market performance. The Tortoise Water Index® is a float-adjusted, modified market capitalization-weighted index comprised of companies that are materially engaged in the water infrastructure or water management industries. The Tortoise Global Water Index® is a proprietary, rules-based, modified capitalization-weighted, float-adjusted index comprised of companies that are materially engaged in the water infrastructure or water equipment/services industries. It is not possible to invest directly in an index.

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The Morningstar Rating[™] for funds, or "star rating," is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history without adjustment for sales load. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive five stars, the next 22.5% receive four stars, the next 35% receive three stars, the next 22.5% receive two stars, and the bottom 10% receive one star. The Overall Morningstar Rating[™] for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five- and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating[™] metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36 - 59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60 - 119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. As of 6/30/2025, TBLU was rated against 112 Natural Resources Funds over the three-year period and 105 over the five-year period. TBLU received five stars for the three-year period and three stars for five-year period. Past performance is no guarantee of future results.
